

# Low Nursing Rates Risk Children's Safety and Health

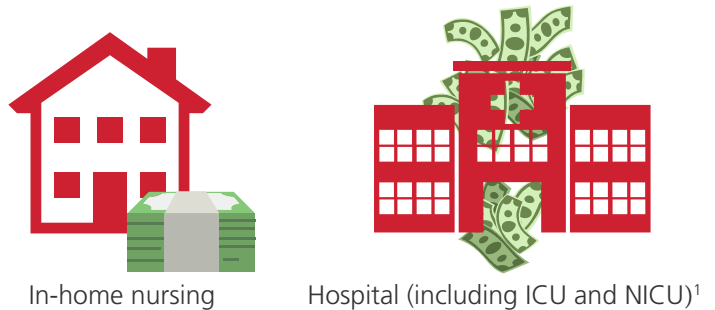
Georgia families rely on home care to receive the high-quality nursing care they need to keep their children at home and out of costlier institutional settings. Unfortunately, long-term underinvestment in the nursing Medicaid reimbursement rates are preventing providers from recruiting and retaining nurses, resulting in access-to-care issues and putting medically fragile children's health at risk.

## What is private duty nursing care under the Georgia Pediatric Program (GAPP)?

- Housed under the Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH).
- Eligible medically fragile children under 21 years of age.
- Physician-ordered medically necessary skilled nursing care in the home.
- As of June 2022, **1,767 children** were receiving in-home services through the GAPP program.
- GAPP is a state-plan service (not a waiver), and is a key service along the long-term services and supports (LTSS) continuum.

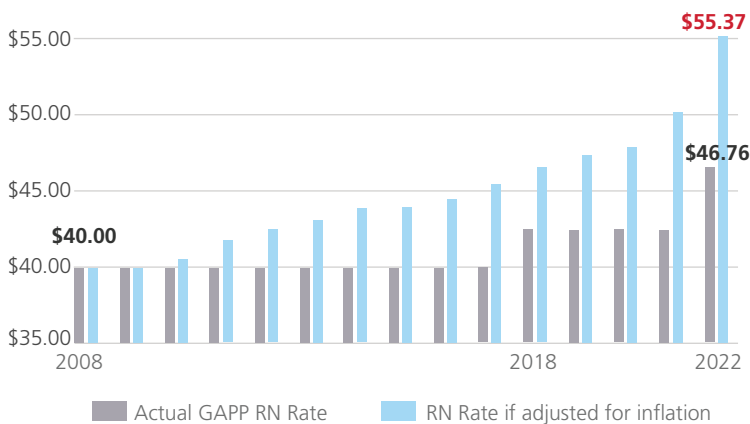
## Weekly Nursing Costs by Settings

## Long-term underinvestment and accumulating inflation has eroded the value of GAPP reimbursement rates over time.<sup>2</sup>



The GAPP population is expected to grow significantly in the next decade, but providers are struggling now to meet the demand for care.<sup>3</sup>
