Low Nursing Rates Risk Patient Safety and Health



Florida home care private duty nursing (PDN) providers have not had a Medicaid rate increase in 28 years. This, coupled with the on-going workforce crisis, has created an environment where providers cannot compete to attract and retain highly qualified nurses, resulting in access to care issues for medically fragile adults, children, and their families throughout the state.

OUR ASK: Support increasing the PDN fee-for-service (FSS) rate to \$50 an hour for RNs and LPNs or \$36 million AND ensure Medicaid Managed Care plans pass that increase to providers so they can recruit and retain quality nurses.

CURRENT FFS RATES: RN = \$30.60/hour and LPN \$25.40/hour

Providers Cannot Attract Qualified RNs and LPNs Due to Wage Disparity

Florida home care providers can only attract 30% of available nurses. Home care loses many qualified staff to hospitals and nursing homes that are offering up to

\$25,000 sign-on bonuses.

Nursing Shortage = Delayed start of care

The vast majority of delayed discharges are due to the home care nurse shortage. **Delayed discharges cost the state money** and prevent medically fragile children & adults from receiving care where they want — **in their homes.**¹

Not Enough Nurses to Fill Hours

On average, BAYADA offices cannot fill **500** of their weekly scheduled hours, leaving an annual deficit of **26,000** hours of care.








Unintended Consequences of Unfilled Hours
